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

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MARCH ON MOSCOW!

20,000 U.S. TRAINED OMON POLICE AND DOGS HARASS "MARCH ON MOSCOW" MARCH ON MOSCOW (July 12-20, 1997)

The situation in Russia is getting worse and worse. The industrial output is now 47% of the level of 1989, factories are closing down. The agricultural sector is unable to feed the country. The kolkhozes have been forcibly dismantled and its members deprived of the necessary means of production to such an extent that they can barely feed themselves. According to official statistics, just 20% of the goods sold in shops are produced in Russia - the rest are imported. The vast majority of the population has been forced to struggle for subsistence, to grow potatoes on their own, without which millions would simply starve to death. The Russian population is decreasing by a rate of 1 million per year, mainly due to the increase of the death rate and the decrease of the birth rate. Life expectancy has dropped by ten years, and in some regions, the life expectancy has dropped to the low 50's. The free health care system has been liquidated. Poor people, like pensioners, are deprived of any kind of medical care. Real unemployment has reached unbearable levels in some regions; to take an example, in the southern Republic of Chuvashia, the unemployment has reached 70%.

While the situation in Moscow can be still considered only moderately bad, with many medium and large trading companies and banks flourishing, the economy in the regions has simply collapsed. Money resources have been concentrated in the capital to such an extent that exchanges between enterprises that are still operating in the regions are done without money and workers are not paid in money; when they are eventually paid, they are paid in production goods. According to official statistics, the average income per person in Moscow is 3.3 million rubles (about \$550, and this is the average, since the disproportions in income are tremendous). This is four times the average in Russia as a whole and almost ten times as large as in the poorest regions. Wage are mainly in arrears in the regions, whereas in Moscow, the situation in this respect is not that dramatic. In addition, the workers' and strike movements are far more active in the regions, where they are beginning to acquire a clear political character.

In these conditions, the political situation in the regions is worsening day by day. There is not a single day when a factory is not on strike in the regions. Economic strikes are developing into political ones. Recent examples were the general political strike in the mining region of Kusbas (July 10-11) that shut down the region and the general political strike in North Ossetia (July 2-4) that developed into a popular rebellion against the government (the pro-Yeltsin president of the republic fled the region for Moscow).

The mass popular movement Labor Russia, led by Victor Anpilov, organized a political march on Moscow, starting from the regions. The idea of the political march was supported by different political forces. Seven deputies of the State Duma signed a declaration in support of the march and called for support from the Russian people, specially in the regions. The march was meant to start off in the "red belt" around Moscow. Columns departed from 6 towns: Tvyer, Yaroslavl, Vladimir, Riazan, Tula and Smolensk.

The two main columns were led by Victor Anpilov departing from Tula and Vladeslav Terekhov (the chairman of the Union of

Army Officers) from Riazan. The demonstrators covered an average of 200km, mainly by foot, going through the main industrial centres that surround Moscow. Hundreds of activists started off but soon, the number of marchers increased. After the first day, the number of marchers tripled, despite the rain and cold weather. Rallies were held in tens of cities gathering thousands and thousands of demonstrators protesting the anti-popular regime. The most important rallies took place in Podolsk, Serpukhov and Kalinin, anti-Yeltsin strongholds. In Podolsk, 5,000 demonstrators escorted the marchers to the edge of the town. The response from the population was warm. People brought food, bread, berries, etc.

The most important slogans were: "Down with the anti-popular

regime", "Bring the Yeltsin gang to trial", "Down with the government". The population gave a positive response to these slogans.

The Yeltsin regime did its best to prevent people from participating in the march. Trains did not stop where marchers would be. The march was restricted in many areas. All columns originating from different points merged on July 17 on the outskirts of Moscow. The next morning, thousands of marchers started to cross into Moscow. Tens of thousands of police officers and special police forces met and stopped the marchers. The marchers replied by shutting down traffic on the main highways of Moscow, holding a sit-down strike. The Kremlin was surrounded by thousands of police forces with dogs. For this last new acquisition of the

Moscow police department, Russians have to thank instructors from the United States who provided the training. The rally planned to be held outside the Kremlin was banned. Instead, a rally was held in October Square, gathering thousands of people. Altogether in Moscow alone, more than 20,000 police participated in the operation.

According to the main organizer of the political protest, Victor Anpilov, the main political tasks posed for this action were fulfilled. The march carried out public agitation against the regime and for socialism. Delegates from 50 regions were present in the action. There were delegates from Byelorussia, the Ukraine, Georgia and Tadzhikistan as well.

The resolution of the rally held in Moscow condemned the anti-popular policies of the Yeltsin government and called on the Russian people to form Soviets of workers in order to organize the popular rebellion against the anti-popular regime. The resolution also protested the plans for the removal of Lenin's Mausoleum and predicted that this action would result in the outbreak of a bloody civil war.

POPULAR REBELLION IN NORTH OSSETIA (JULY 1997)

Based on an interview with Nartikov Konstantin Tembolatovitch, member of the Ossetian regional committee of the All-Union Communist Party, Bolshevik (AUCP[B]).

Comrade Tembolatovitch was sent as a delegate to the March On Moscow organized by Workers Russia by the North Ossetian regional organization of the AUCP[B] with the task of establishing links with the popular protests against the anti-popular regime in other parts of Russia. The popular rebellion took place on July 2-4 throughout the Caucasian Republic of North Ossetia, which remains part of the Russian Federation. This popular movement was led mainly by communist organizations, the AUCP[B], the regional organization of the Communist Party of the Russian Federation, Workers Russia, the Union of Officers and the unions as well.

Thousands of people poured into the capital, Vladikavkaz (formerly Orjonikidze), from all parts of the Republic. The capital was shut down, traffic, public transport, production ... The demonstrators took over the town, explained to the people the class essence of the regime, its antipopular character and the way out of the present situation. The only way out of this situation is through the unification of the progressive forces and only by revolutionary means. Only a revolution can save the country from the catastrophe. The mass media is in the hands of the regime - it either openly lies or simply keeps quiet about many things. Despite the anti-popular, anti-worker propaganda of the mass media, we are actively working in order to make possible a workers' uprising this coming fall. The enemy doesn't leave us any other way out but by seizing power by revolutionary, violent means. We have no other choice but to arm ourselves.

The demonstrations in Vladikavkaz gathered thousands of people. The AUCP[B] had the largest column. Workers from all factories sent delegates. Thousands of workers participated in the actions. The anti-Yeltsin sentiments of the working class and the population in general is evident. The police forces sympathized with the slogans of the demonstrators, reflecting the general sentiments of the broad masses. The militia rejected some attempts of the secret security services to attack the crowd. The presidential institutions became largely isolated during the events. All buildings where presidential institutions are located were picketed. Presidential institutions were therefore forced to stop functioning. The pro-Yeltsin president of the Republic of North Ossetia fled the republic and headed for Moscow.

In the events were present all nationalities of the republic, but mainly Russians and Ossetians.

All political forces involved in the events pointed to the necessity of linking up the popular uprising in North Ossetia with other popular movements in other parts of Russia, to unite their forces against the Yeltsin regime. Therefore, delegates have been sent to the March On Moscow and the rank and file membership of the CPRF adopted a declaration addressed to their parliamentary fraction in the State Duma, headed by Gennady Zyuganov. In general, the leadership of the CPRF, specially its parliamentary fraction, do not seem to worry much about the concerns of the Russian people. However, the rank and file has made a positive move towards the ordinary people.

The Republic of North Ossetia has become one of the most powerful revolutionary centres in Russia. Stalin is highly esteemed by the people. The republic is one of the poorest region in the whole Russian Federation. Wage arrears in the republic range from 5 to 9 months. Most of the workers work almost for free. There have been many cases when workers or members of their families have died of health problems connected to severe under-nourishment. The situation has been substantially worsened by the 6-year war with the neighboring Ingushian Republic. This war has been provoked by appealing to the basest nationalist instinct and

fostered by the mafia that supports and finances the presidential institutions of both republics. This is an open war for the physical liquidation of the working class. Everyday, workers are being massacred by mercenaries in this war. The president of the Republic of North Ossetia is deeply involved in this war, and is basically financed by it. The old kolkhoz system has been forcibly dismantled. Apart from a few individual farmers who have profited from special contracts with the directors of the kolkhozes, the majority of the peasants have been deprived of the main means of production, and are not in a position to purchase equipment. Most of the peasants are just engaged in their own subsistence and cannot produce for the country.

The Yeltsin regime has lost control of the regions. Presidential institutions are helpless against the anger and outrage of the people. The working class and the ordinary people are more sympathetic than ever to the idea of restoring Soviet power. The regime has been obliged to resort to open cheating in the bourgeois elections to retain power. For instance, in our republic, 67% voted for Zyuganov, although it has to be noted that the people did not vote for the person of Zyuganov, but for the restoration of Soviet power.



5TH ANNIVERSARY OF NORTHSTAR COMPASS

It is usual on any anniversary to look back and try to judge whether the goals that were set out were followed or accomplished. In this regard, it is useful to look at the "CREDO NORTHSTAR OF COMPASS" which, in essence, was the road that Northstar Compass set itself which was adopted, developed by NSC Conferences and also by the decisions of the Canadian Friends of Soviet People, as well as the "U.S. Friends of Northstar Compass", besides the Editorial Board that is listed on the masthead of NSC.

EDITORIAL

Our NSC Credo states:

"Northstar Compass is the public voice of the Canadian Friends of Soviet People (formerly Canada-USSR Association) and is dedicated to the resurrection of the Soviet Union as a Socialist State.

In our tradition since 1918 (Hands Off Russia Committee), we are devoted to international co-operation in building socialism and solidarity in a world at peace."

Have we done justice in these 5 years to the credo that was adopted and approved during these 5 years? Have we managed to inform, given all the information that we received to our readers? Were we accurate in our prognosis and criticism of the events as they were transpiring in former Soviet Union? And above all, did we manage to satisfy the demands of our readers that now span the globe in 61 countries of the world? The answers to the above questions are varied and judging by the growth of our readership, the answer is that we have managed to fulfill most of our Credo (not all of it, unfortunately) even by the sheer fact of managing on a volunteer basis to continue publishing NSC each month for these 5 years!

Since the start of Northstar Compass 5 years ago with the aim of filling in the void that was left in the progressive movement and media at that time of "perestroika" (destroika is more the proper word for it) and the practical dismemberment of the Canada-USSR Association, to be followed by the "Concerned Friends of Soviet People" and now, by the Canadian Friends of Soviet People.

In spite of financial problems that are constantly with us, NSC has managed to keep its head above water and to continue to serve our readers.

Our contacts in the Soviet Union keep growing and we are quoted and reprinted in many newspapers and periodicals in the former USSR, as well as in many other countries where NSC is read.

We feel that the efforts and work done by Northstar Compass can be judged by the attacks that are launched against it by enemies of Socialism, the Soviet Union, Lenin and Stalin. Perfect example was the attack against Northstar Compass that was perpetrated by the former Ambassador to Canada, Alexander Yakovlev; in actual fact, the "Gray Cardinal of Perestroika" through a couple of so-called "correspondents" from Moscow newspaper "Selskaya Zhizn", on which we did an exposé in the February issue (#7) of NSC this year. Obviously, NSC must be getting under the skin of these turncoats if someone of that stature, the darling of CIA, Alexander Yakovlev, would deem it necessary to attack the editor Michael Lucas as he did!

Is our position regarding different communist and workers' movements in former Soviet Union correct? Do we support certain parties that we feel follow the road towards the resurrection of the USSR above others? Do we make comments and observations about certain parties that under the name of "Marxists", "Communists" are in actual fact abetting and directly or indirectly supporting the present policies of Yeltsin's regime?



The answer to the above two questions is a resounding – "YES"!

Does this rub against the grain of some of the Communist Parties in the world? Yes, obviously it does! Why? Because history teaches us (or should teach us) that under the name of some of these "Communists" the Soviet Union and other former Socialist countries were sold down the river, into the hands of Imperialism! Lenin and Stalin warned the movement against these hidden enemies, who under "patriotic mantle" were the Trojan horses inside the Communist movements and were the main movements and were the main culprits who undermined and eventually temporarily defeated the Communist leading parties in these countries!

Our 5th Anniversary Conference will take place in February of 1998 where delegates from Canada, USA, and foreign guests will be present, including leading comrades from Russia and Europe. We expect scores of delegates plus guests. This Conference may well turn out to be the turning point in our work for friendship with Soviet people. One of the suggestions from many quarters is to discuss the possibility of establishing an International Council for Friendship with Soviet People which is now needed more than ever, in order to show solidarity with the strivings of Soviet people for the resurrection of the Soviet Union and socialism!

Of course, there have already taken place world-wide congresses, meetings of communist and workers' parties, discussing ways and means of overcoming their differences and approaches to solidify the Communist movement in the world.

According to our information, gamered from countless newspapers, statements and proclamations, there are about 4 world centres that are vying for world communist recognition, some publishing journals, some trying to establish an international Marxist journal ... others criticising each other's attempts.

These attempts are to be supported since they show the tremendous need for a common front against Imperialism and the danger of fascism which is very real. BUT ... while these attempts at a common understanding are taking place, with different agendas and unfortunately with some "competition for a leadership role" - the enemy is uniting itself ever more closely to try and put the final nail in the coffin of former socialist countries – get them ensnared, tiedinto NATO and thus have the socalled "legal right" to invade the former socialist countries in order to protect their interests by utilizing the present traitors to help them do the job!

It seems to us that the more information we receive from former Soviet Union, the more we delve into the intricacies of their problems, the more we are convinced that some of the existing communist movements now on the scene in former USSR should be looked at ever more closely. Why? Because the criteria of these movements should be above all to unite their efforts for the resurrection of the Soviet Union, not only of Russia alone and for establishment of Socialism and not a mixture of capitalism, dolled up in the trimmings of "socialism"!

For those readers who might think that the temporarily defeated Soviet Union and socialism does not affect the future of the world's working class, let them stop and think what was stated by the Wall Street Journal after USSR collapsed: "... there are now no such things as jobs for life or universal benefits, which were merely the product of the special conditions and circumstances following the Second World War." It further went on to say, "... since the West has won the Cold War and the Soviet Union has disintegrated, there is no longer any need to appease the working people."

Also, it is needed to remember this cardinal fact. Social Democracy

HAVE YOU RENEWED YOUR SUB? was always the bulwark against Communism and an important diversion for the working class, the bourgeoisie needed social democracy as long as there was a communist threat. Now that there's no longer the USSR, capitalism does not need social democracy to be a bulwark against real socialism!

Therefore, the present events taking place in the world, where the aim is to influence the working class, all sorts of "parties" and "movements" are born or hatched in order to derail the working class from its revolutionary path. A case in point is the present "Independent Trade Unions" now existing in former USSR – easily used and manipulated by the present regime in order to divert the working class from its main aim – to overthrow the regime of exploiters.

One of the roles of Northstar Compass is to expose these pseudo "Communists-Marxists-Patriots" that are being used as diversionary attempts against genuine Communist parties and peoples' movements.

This proposed movement is not a political party, but an attempt to organize friendship forces into an influential force for friendship. Each country had or has friendship society with former USSR, and they could affiliate in a common program to build solidarity with Soviets, meet regularly, agree on plans of action and methods of carrying them out. This International Council is not in competition with any existing movement!

Therefore, an organization such as is being proposed: "International Council (or Society) For Friendship With Soviet People" would be a viable people-to-people world movement that would have as its main aim the friendship with Soviets who would feel the international solidarity, thus helping them in their struggles to

replace the present regime, as was the former Union of Soviet Friendship Societies. This international movement would be the present day "Hands Off Russia Committee" which was set up in many countries of the world in 1918 when 14 countries invaded the young Soviet state. Although this is 1997, the situation is even more critical. The International Monetary Fund, the World Bank and Transnational Corporations have a stranglehold on the former USSR and other socialist countries, besides having their agents in practically all communist and people's movements there. This is NO exaggeration!

We feel that the future of Northstar Compass (which now cannot be said that it's the "organ of the Canadian Friends of Soviet People" only) the future of friendship with Soviet is growing and we have to grow and take steps to enlarge our activities and above all, our influence in this respect.

"INVITATION"

The journal and movement entitled "International Struggle Marxist Leninist", was born at Ischia, Italy in 1996.

As the Principles, and Statement indicate, it was a movement born out of a recognition, that the international Marxist-Leninist movement was divided. We were mandated at the Founding meeting to convene a Second Conference, to examine the way forward, and to try to engage further groups and organizations that are of Marxist-Leninist conviction. At this meeting, we wish to constructively discuss the international movement and whether these current divisions can be bridged. What are the divisions? How are the deep theoretical divisions to be debated, or is there no point in discussing them? What practical activities, in the form of United Front work, can be engaged in - short of a full agreement and resolution of these differences?

Unless the movement internationally can resolve these issues, many comrades are likely to remain confused, and in this we include ourselves. Since the attack on Khrushchev, led by Albania and China, there has been no single journal and/or forum for such a serious debate. Yet, such a debate is exactly what is needed in order to resolve these problems. We must remember that this was the way that Iskra, under Lenin's leadership, accepted the challenge of forming one great river of Bolshevism, out of the smaller rivulets of struggle, that existed before the debates led by Iskra. We must remember that Lenin pointed out that without revolutionary theory, there can be no revolutionary practice!

In this spirit, we fraternally ask your organization, to be present at Conway Hall, London UK, on the 8-9-10th December 1997. We ask that you send immediately to the London convening organizers listed below, your acceptance of this task, and the name of the organizations you represent, with some of your literature for approval of credentials by the organizers. Board and lodging will be provided once at London.

Conference fees should be according to what the delegations can afford. One delegation is entitled to one vote and one speaker, although observers with nonspeaking rights are more than welcome. LONG LIVE MARX, ENGELS, LENIN AND STALIN!

MEETING OF U.S. MEMBERS OF NORTHSTAR EDITORIAL BOARD

There was an initial discussion of holding a meeting in New York to commemorate the 80th Anniversary of the Russian Revolution on November 7th. It was agreed that we would propose doing this as a coalition to a wide variety of groups. Such a meeting could be very important in developing support for the revolutionary movement in the former Soviet Union. A subcommittee has been formed to follow up on some practical details.

On Sunday, July 6, the U.S. members of the editorial board held a meeting, as a welcome antidote to the patriotic hoopla of that weekend (July 4 being U.S. Independence Day). The meeting welcomed Tony Mestre from Casa de las Americas as our newest member.

We had a short discussion of any contact being able to take some Northstar's to Cuba for the Youth Festival, but the chance seems increasingly unlikely.

There was a short report on the national labor march in Detroit on June 21 in support of the locked out newspaper workers. The march was huge, with up to 100,000 workers, very militant on a trade union basis, but the union leaderships tried to have the marchers steer clear of any socialist political agitation. A report should be sent to Northstar on this, as well as on the Wheeling-Pitt strike.

A large part of the meeting was devoted to discussion of Michael Lucas' proposal for the formation of an International Friends of Soviet Peoples. The sentiment was overwhelmingly in favor. It was felt that the international subscribers' list had grown, including representatives of groups as well as individuals, that there was a basis for such a group. This group could directly coordinate support activity for the Soviet Peoples, which will be of growing importance as the struggle sharpens over there.

Bill Doares gave a report on some events in the former Soviet Union. There was a march recently with 100,000 people in Kiev calling for the restoration of Soviet property relations. There will be a March on Moscow beginning July 12 against the Yeltsin regime led by Victor Anpilov of Workers' Russia.

It was requested that Northstar have a regular column on strikes taking place in the former Soviet Union.

The group concluded with an emotional appeal to people in the U.S. to fight against the embargo against Cuba which is causing continued suffering for the Cuban people.



WHY DIDN'T DUMA MEMBERS LISTEN TO THEIR OWN COMMITTEE?

A State Duma Committee (Russian Parliament) was formed to analyze the effects of privatization on Russia during the period of 1992-1996. In their report to Duma (Parliament), the Committee told the government to suspend privatization until October or November of 1997. The report was presented by Duma member, M. Ganayev.

Part of the report explained:

• Privatization was a campaign to transfer national wealth to a small group of people;

• Privatization failed to make production more effective; instead, there was a two-fold drop in production accompanied by inflation;

• 57.4% of enterprises which were privatized in Russia lost 9 quadrillion rubles in 1995 alone;

• There was also a blow to the social structures ...

- Lower standard of living
- Systematic failure to pay wages and pensions
- 31.9 million Russians have earnings below subsistence level;

• Privatization failed to trigger an increase in investments in Russia. As an example: investments in production facilities in 1996 was \$64 billion or 18% less than in 1995 when it dropped 10% from the previous year;

• The ruble exchange rate now (April 17, 1997) is 5,750 rubles for \$1 American. The rate of exchange while USSR was in existence was \$2 Canadian for 1 Soviet ruble.

COMMENT:

The above was garnered from the Internet with information supplied by Russian Interfax service and sent to NSC by our member of Editorial Board Jerry Morse.

Questions that remain to be asked, and we hope that our Soviet readers will supply the answers to NSC are:

• Where are all the billions of dollars that are being poured into the coffers of the present regime going? Although our readers have a good idea, it would be nice if our Soviet readers would tell us in their own words.

• Why did not the DUMA heed the advice of its own Commission, since Duma has the largest representations of Deputies from Zyuganov's Communist Party of Russian Federation? How did these "communist deputies" vote on this Commission's report? Did they adopt it, did they discuss it, did they shelve it, or did they just ignore it?

• Why would this report only see the light of day now, on Internet and not in the daily media? • We would ask that members of the Russian Communist Party (Zyuganov) who do read Northstar Compass to give an answer to our readers of their position on this very important Duma Commission report.

CHINA, BEWARE!

If our readers will remember, under the leadership of Chiang Kaishek, millions of Chinese people died of starvation. Standard Oil and other transnational corporations prospered. Kaishek was a Christian and he praised the "democracy" that ruled China. Now that Hong Kong threw off the yoke of colonialism, an event that China had to wait for 156 years, the USA and Britain are warning China to adhere to "democracy"!

We read almost daily about the "massacre" (counter-revolution) in Tiennaman Square where over 300 people were reportedly killed. This is almost as many as people getting killed democratically in the U.S. monthly, since the constitution gives everyone the right to have guns.

The U.S. invaded Vietnam and massacred over 3 million people "democratically", destroyed the country, losing 58,000 of their own troops, who were mostly innocent kids. Vietnam was a country that was occupied for over 122 years by foreign countries.

Kuwait was a rich oil producing country, but in 1967, British troops invaded and took over the oil fields and set up a separate country which then they called Kuwait. Many of those that sold out the country were promoted to Royalty status by Britain. Many thousands of people who came to work to Kuwait were not afforded any status or hope to obtain citizenship, they had no rights and were, in actual fact, slaves. Saddam Hussein invaded Kuwait in an attempt to reunite the country into one as was historically the case. The U.S. then invaded and with overwhelming force, drove the Iraqis out in order to restore "democracy" in Kuwait. These forces destroyed most of the infrastructure while killing tens of thousands of people. This was accomplished while outnumbering the Iraqi forces by 20 to 1.

The globalization process

challenges some familiar assumptions. Until now, for instance, it was conventional wisdom that technological change and increased productivity would translate into more jobs and higher wages. But in the past few years, technological changes have eliminated more jobs than they have created.

• Canadian government has permitted the Canadian National Railway to sell Port of Churchill, not to Canadians, but to American OmniTRAX, after the Canadian government modernized the port with taxpayers' money.

"Why are there 40 million poor people in America? When you begin to ask that question, you begin to question the capitalistic economy. And I am simply saying that more and more, we've got to ask questions about the whole society. We are called upon to help the discouraged beggars in life's marketplace. But one day, we must come to see that an edifice that produces beggars needs restructuring." (Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., 1967) Dom Helder Camara put it even more simply: "When I give food to the poor, they call me a saint. When I ask why the poor have no food, they call me a communist."

Dr. King was a moderate, politically speaking, and Camara is, or was, a priest from South America. They both came to accept the truth that when a system is evil, it must be changed. It's not a question of individual morality that makes tobacco companies target youth, knowing that smoking causes cancer. The system makes it mandatory that they expand and capture a bigger part of the market at the expense of competition, that they accumulate capital or perish. The necessity to accumulate capital automatically relegates considerations about destruction of the earth, the atmosphere and life to a secondary position.

Unemployment pushes the stock market up. When inflation threatens, the interest rates are raised to purposely cause unemployment. When there is too much milk, it is dumped on the highways. Corporations and the wealthiest people are subsidized to the tune of over \$440 billion annually, and the homeless sleeping on a grate or in a doorway are cursed and legislated against. These contradictory side shows are not the root of the problem, however. It is capital's inherent inability to limit itself, "irrespective of the consequences" and its absolute need to crush anything that stands in its way that prevents an equitable sharing of the resources of this planet.

The goal of every major company is to drive its competition out of business. Twenty-one percent of children under 18 live in poverty in the United States, and that is considered to be good because it drives wages and benefits down and

makes the U.S. more "competitive". When AT&T laid off 40,000 workers, it gave its CEO's \$16 million in bonuses and stock options. When Caterpillar mangled the UAW and literally destroyed hundreds of workers' families, its CEO got a 75% raise.

What makes the "system" so insidious is that it IS a system and no one person has to take responsibility for it. Inside the system are thousands of little systems or institutions for which no one person need take responsibility. Slavery was one of those. Old Tom Jefferson was reportedly a good person whose slave-holdings did not apparently reflect badly on him because slavery was an accepted institution. He held his slaves until his death.

Perhaps this article has not provided any information not already known or rejected, but the hope is that it will make each of us come a step closer to evaluating our own role in changing the system, not just opting out of it or salving our conscience by individual acts that leave the system intact. Can we continue to talk of morality as we blithely groom children to compete in a system which measures success by the gap that can be created between one's self and others?

NEWS FROM FORMER SOVIET UNION INTERVIEW WITH MEMBER OF THE CC OF THE CPRF

Moscow, May 1997

Q: Could you please introduce yourself?

<u>Avalianin</u>: Deputy of the State Duma, Avalianin Timiriay Georgievitch.

Q: You are a member of the CPRF (Communist Party of the Russian Federation).

Avalianin: Yes, I am the secretary of the Kemerov region CPRF organization, at Kuzbas (miners' region), member of the central committee of the party.

Q: Could you please talk a little bit about yourself, a bit of your political biography, your stand towards Brezhnev, Perestroika ... in a few words.

<u>Avalianin</u>: In 1980, I had a situation with the Politburo that could have ended up pitifully. In one of the letters addressed to the Politburo, I stressed that they cannot govern the country any more, for which they almost dismissed me.

Q: Did they publish anything about you at that time?

Avalianin: Yes, there was a big article published in Pravda at the end of Perestroika, sometime in 1989, and also in the Moscow Times. I wasn't very enthusiastic then, neither am I today. The decline in the rate of economic growth in Brezhnev's times was obvious to everybody, the fact that it was at this time that the underground economy appeared, corruption, everybody could see it. Q: What positions did you raise?

Avalianin: We had a very simple point of view: the decline in productivity of labor, in production. Sometime in 1979, according to my own calculations, the rate of growth of the economy hit zero, despite the official statistics that talked of 1.5 – the economy entered a period of stagnation; some branches sort of grew, while others declined.

Q: It is well known that the State Committee of Statistics provided very different figures for the rate of economic growth. Even in the times of Perestroika, the government claimed positive rates of growth. How could you explain this?

Avalianin: The point here is based on the growing gap between natural and value based indexes. Basically, the economy was "growing" due to the rise of prices, since many economists did not base their calculation on natural indexes but on value indexes. These calculations are an expression of the ever-growing gap between natural and value indexes in the Soviet Union. The production of some goods was initially measured in natural terms, however the official statistics required a transformation of these natural terms into value terms. Calculations based on value terms are absolutely inexact.

Q: You were saying that together with you, many others protested the state of affairs in the Soviet Union. What became of these people?

<u>Avalianin:</u> These people, mainly economists, I am not talking about people like Novodvorskaya.¹ They expressed their views verbally and in print.

Q: What about CPRF and Zyuganov's policies?

Avalianin: Judging by the last, 4th party congress, one couldn't observe any major differences between their reports and theses to the party congress. The content of Zyuganov's report to the congress did not correspond to what was discussed in the CC plenum right before the congress. This report was not submitted to the plenum. He just outlined it. He was then asked concrete questions regarding the content of his report: "What will be the relation of the party towards the working class, its role in your report?" He answered: "Yes, it will." In the party report, this question was omitted. The same with the question of proletarian internationalism. This question and many other things were also omitted. But at the presidium, with Kuptsov, this report was read and subsequently accepted as the main CC report.

Q: What could you tell us about the political line that Zyuganov represents, in terms of its ideological roots (are we dealing with a continuation of Gorbachev or something else?)?

Avalianin: One can say that the masses of communists and sympathizers firmly stand for the restoration of the Soviet Union. As for Zvuganov, let's take the question of Byelorussia: In Byelorussia, we have two main communist parties. One supports Lukashenko's regimeled by Chikin, the other is opposed to him, led by Kolyakin. Chikin's party supports the restoration of the Soviet Union and its membership embraces more than 80 representative to their congress, whereas he sent a representative to Kolvakin's party congress. In the last CPRF congress, both Byelorussian politicians were invited. However, Kolvakin was sitting at the very front whereas Chikin was somewhere in the far rear of the hall.³

From the time of the formation of the CPRF, Zyuganov's policy always avoided any sort of practical action for the possible restoration of the Soviet Union. The same thing regarding the attempts towards the

unification of the communist movement of the former Soviet Union. Those members of the CPRF who are closer to the working class advocate the slogan "Workers of the world, unite!", i.e., they advocate a state-run economy, the social character of the means of production. On the contrary, Zyuganov supports the coexistence of different forms of property, popular power, etc., but he never talks about proletarian internationalism. Everybody stands for the restoration of the Soviet Power, while Zvuganov keeps talking about parliamentary forms of power. He always omits the word Soviet wherever he goes.

Q: Zyuganov has a Ph.D. His works have been published in recent years. What could you tell us about Zyuganov from the ideological point of view?

Avalianin: As for his books and other publications, it is physically impossible to write as many as have been published. In my opinion, a substantial part of his works have been written by "Dukhovnoe Nasledie".4 This organization initially called itself the Soviet-American University, then it renamed itself the Russian-American University. Despite the direct and tight relations of this organization with the CIA and the US government, Zvuganov has never denied his relation with this organization. Let's take a look at their newspaper [he unfolds a newspaper that he brought specially for the occasion]: Here, you can see a report on their last congress. Take the report of their leader, Podberiozkin, anti-communist from the beginning to the end. Take Zyuganov's speech at this congress [published in the same issue]: "I always participate in any activity organized by "Dukhovnoe Nasledie" because people gathered here express their grief over what is happening in the country, here are representatives of leading scientific

schools of our country. Here, one has the opportunity to express different views, and there is the possibility that they will be listened to."

You should note that already in 1988-90, it was clearly seen that Gorbachev preferred visiting Germany and the USA, to staying home and that here, he felt himself as a foreigner. The same thing happens to Zyuganov now. At this congress of "Dukhovnoe Nasledie", he feels at home whereas at the congress of communists, he feels uncomfortable, sneaky, always afraid of getting exposed.

Q: What could you tell us about his contacts abroad, in Germany, USA? What about his contacts with foreign communist organizations?

Avalianin: First of all, he conceives himself as the president of Russia, a president who would represent those Russians who stand for private property, who support foreign-inspired paths of development for Russia. Therefore, he doesn't present himself abroad as, for example, Peter the Great or Stalin⁵ but as Gorbachev - not as the representative of a great power, but as the leader of a country that goes begging for money the way Yeltsin does today. It is natural that he does not personally meet representatives of foreign communist parties. He meets with everybody abroad except with communists. I remember when, in one of his trips to the USA, someone asked Zyuganov a question like: "You know the Russian state and political situation is very unstable; in these conditions, we would like to know whom to support there." To which, he replied: "You should understand that there is only one party, the CPRF, that is now capable of preventing a social explosion." Preventing a social explosion means prevention a revolution. You should understand that Zyuganov is not interested in those people abroad

who once, at the time of the foreign intervention after the revolution, organized campaigns: "Hands Off Russia". He is just interested in establishing contacts with those who have financial and political power abroad.

Q: It is well known that former members of the East European bloc, like the Czech Republic, Slovakia, Poland, as well as countries like the Ukraine, find themselves under the economic and political orbit of Germany. Russia, on the other hand, is under the influence of the USA. Is this fact reflected in Zyuganov's foreign policy?

Avalianin: Yes, of course. The main destination in his and his representatives' trips abroad is the USA. As far as I know, in 1996, he personally visited the USA no less than 5 times. I made inquiries at the American Embassy in Moscow about the organizations that invite him. One, I found out that he had been invited by the New York Council of Foreign Relations.⁶ This is an organization that includes several former presidents of the USA. As far as I am informed, Zyuganov never reported to the plenum of the CC about a meeting with the CPUSA. The same thing with the European CPs, including the French and Italian.

Q: At the time of the presidential election, the Western media at one point started to present Zyuganov as a sort of hard-liner, who stands for the state interests of Russia, the defense of its monopolies, its army, who strongly opposed the expansion of NATO. On the one hand in Russia, he verbally promised to defend Russian interests in regard to the West, but on the other, he keeps close contacts with the Americans. How can these two opposing positions coexist?

Avalianin: How can anybody remain the head of the Russian CP if he openly says in the presidential

campaign that in case he comes to power, NATO will come here, that he will destroy our industrial potential, that he will dissolve the army ... Nobody would do that in the presidential campaign. You would be shot just like that. As for today, Zyuganov has two faces. Party resolutions are party resolutions, electoral programs are electoral programs, but so far, his practice is a different world. His words differ 180 degrees from his practice.

Q: Then Zyuganov's line doesn't differ much from Chubais?⁷

Avalianin: Take for example the draft law of the "distribution of production".8 This draft was proposed by the Americans to the Russian government. I even have a copy of the English version of the draft that the Americans printed for their own circulation. The Russian draft and the American one, I swear, are like twins. Fortunately, we in the Duma managed to reject the draft last Friday. Zyuganov supported the draft, and the same for Rizhkov.⁹ When the Duma rejected the draft, we noticed they started to feel very nervous. This draft proposed by the Americans embodies a model of the Russian economy subjugated by foreign capital.

Q: You could say that Zyuganov wouldn't be in a position of defending his country against the West. He would become a second Gorbachev.

Avalianin: Yes, of course. He is not the kind of person that could become the leader of his own people in the defense of their homeland.

Q: Does Zyuganov have control over the communist fraction in the Duma?

Avalianin: No, he does not. You should also note that the Duma has proposed drafts of laws that are difficult not to adopt. Take for example the law on the raising of the minimum wage and things of that sort. In the main, we are just left with the possibility of supporting the present regime for the subjugation of Russia to foreign interests.

Q: How then does he interact with the vast majority of the communist fraction that he does not control?

Avalianin: He interacts with the communist fraction in the Duma via certain individuals – for example, via Lukyanov.¹⁰ Lukyanov comes to the fraction saying: this or that law is wonderful; if we adopt it, we'll be much better off, etc. However, it is becoming more and more complicated for Zyuganov to control the communist fraction. Please note that this Zyuganovite clique that surrounds him, something like 15 deputies, wouldn't strongly object to the dissolution of the Duma. See what they have done: now the CPRF has entered the popular-left union of Russia. According to the electoral law, a party that enters an electoral bloc doesn't have the right to put forward its own candidates, only through the given electoral bloc. It turns out now that the central committee of the CPRF will not be able to propose its own candidates in next elections. Communists will not be proposed any more. Under the red banner, obscure people will be elected. You should have heard that in the gubernatorial elections in the regions, the left-patriotic front is doing well. Out of 36 governors elected from the front, just 7 can be considered "red". The rest are like Rutskoi. Take the talk given by one of them at the past congress of the CPRF, the governor of Kamchatka. He said: "No matter how hard I search for red governors, I can't find any."


Q: I would like to understand. You say Zyuganov does not have control over his own parliamentary fraction, needless to say, he does not have control over the rank-and-file. How is it possible that he has been re-elected almost unanimously at the last congress?

Avalianin: Inertia. The same inertia that kept Gorbachev in power – "if not Gorbachev, who else then?"

Q: Was there an alternative to Zyuganov at the last congress?

Avalianin: No, absolutely not. The opposition to Zyuganov is overwhelming, but nobody was bold enough to propose any individual to replace Zyuganov.

Q: Is there discipline in the CPRF? Does such a party really exist then? What is the position of the rank-and-file membership with respect to the results of the last congress, and to the presidential elections?

Avalianin: Take for example the last presidential elections. While Zyuganov was talking about the acceptance of different forms of property, the so-called popular power, I and together with me most of the leaders in the regions and all the rank-and-file members of the CPRF, cried: "If Zyuganov comes to power, Socialism will be restored, Soviet power will be restored, the Soviet Union will be restored." According to our calculations, Zyuganov won the presidential elections with 36.5 against 33.5 million votes. Then Zyuganov, on the

very next day after the elections, admits defeat and congratulates Yeltsin.

Q: This is interesting. We all remember at the time of the electoral campaign, Zyuganov, under the pressure of the rank-and-file membership, was conscious of the possibility of cheating in the counting of the votes, as indeed obviously happened. Then he promised he would gather the results from the regions into some independent data network based in the Duma. But the very next morning, he accepted the defeat. Was it physically possible to accomplish this parallel counting? Did this counting actually take place?

Avalianin: As far as I can tell, this parallel counting in the Duma did not take place. Our calculations are based on the obvious contradiction between the official results for the first and second rounds of the presidential elections. There were a large number of regions in which, according to the official results, Zyuganov got more votes than Yeltsin, whereas in the second round, a matter of magic, the results were reversed in favor of Yeltsin. This was clear and flagrant cheating that Zyuganov did not protest. The cheating took place in all regions. The worst examples were in Tatarstan, the Caucasus ... He knew about this, but he accepted the results. For example, we protested in our region and took the case to court. The court rejected our case for a very simple reason: The leader of the party had acknowledged the results and considered the elections fair. Parallel counting took place in the regions, independently, but the results were not compiled by the leadership. Zyuganov was scared to death of winning the elections.

I do not know if he had previously received certain "warnings" from the regime. But I would say that positions were previously distributed and he accepted his.

Let's recall one of the most remarkable sentences of Zyuganov expressed to one of our party ideologists: "How come you still believe in Communism?"

Q: We have been hearing for the past couple of years about an impending split in the CPRF. Isn't this an illusion?

Avalianin: For a split, the existence of at least two factions is necessary. One faction should advocate for one religion, let's say Islam, another for another religion, Christianity. Here, there are no such factions, everybody is Christian here. There is no ground for a split. A split would be possible if one faction would stand in support of Zyuganov and another one against him.

Q: But this is worse than a split. You talk about the large mass of the rank-and-file, the vast majority of the parliamentary communist fraction being out of control of the Zyuganovite leadership, but nevertheless, the status quo is preserved over the years.

<u>Avalianin</u>: I am sure that in the end, an honest person who will embody the ideals of Socialism will inevitably arise and become a new leader. He [Zyuganov] will be left with a small group of supporters and will vanish as others did before him.

Q: Right after the presidential elections, Zyuganov called for the formation of the popular-left front. Some thought he would rename the party, then he couldn't and the idea was dropped. Will he ever use this structure to create a new party?

Avalianin: He is using this front for this purpose, but he will not manage to do it. Besides that, this front exists just within the boundaries of the central boulevard.¹¹ Outside these boundaries, the whole front is made up of communists. There is nobody else there. The only ideas with a future perspective are the ideals of communism. As for Zyuganov, the time will come when he will not be re-elected as the chairman of the party and another will come to replace him. This is objectively based. One should look at this from the point of view of the historical process, not based on the concrete moment.

Q: OK. Then suppose a popular revolution takes over the country, as in Albania, what do you think will happen?

Avalianin: He is a coward; he will never arise as the leader of a popular revolt. He will not call for a popular revolt. Anything that could happen will happen spontaneously, despite him. New leading organs will appear despite him, they will be anti-Zyuganov.

Q: Then let me ask you the following question. You correctly approach this question from the point of view of the historical development. Time by itself means nothing. You say that Zyuganov today is just a formal leader of the party, that in the case of a popular revolt, he will become obsolete, new historical conditions will force him to give up or he would be expelled by the communists. But take the Albanian example. The Socialist party¹² and its leader, Bashkim Fino, has not only saved Berisha from certain collapse under the wave of a popular revolution, but he has prepared the way for a foreign intervention. Here, Zyuganov and Bashkim Fino in essence are the same political figures in two different countries. It is well known that the rank-and-file membership of the Socialist party also participates in the rebellion and it has been the Socialist party that, through its more militant and honest membership, has prevented a march on Tirana. Don't vou think history has given another example that despite his weak position in the party and a definite historical perspective, Zyuganov and the CPRF may still play this sort of dangerous historical role?

Avalianin: Neither Zyuganov nor Gorbachev will play this role. Others will come to replace him. A popular revolt will not bring Zyuganov to power, it will bring others to power. He is too cowardly to accept this role. The revolt may be beaten. Others will come to power.

YOUNG RUSSIAN COMMUNISTS SAY THAT THEY WILL NOT FOLLOW ZYUGANOV!

MOSCOW (AP) – Russia's Communist Party is facing a split, with its youth wing saying it will no longer follow the policies of Communist chief Gennady Zyuganov because they are too moderate.

Following the latest party congress, the Communist Youth Union or Komsomol "stated its independent position and the fact that it is not an appendage of the party", Komsomol leader Igor Malyarov told a press conference.

Malyarov said that young Communists are generally more radical than Zyuganov's allies in the party, whom they accuse of "compromising with the authorities". Komsomol, a mighty arm of the party in Soviet times, almost disappeared with the Soviet collapse. The revived group now numbers about 21,000 members across Russia and only 120 in Moscow, according to Malyarov.

But its rift with Zyuganov is important because the Communists long have had trouble in attracting younger followers.

Malyarov, speaking at a news conference, said Communist Party leaders tried to put pressure on regional Komsomol activists to keep them in line.

"Our position is not an anti-Zyuganov one, it's just independent", he said. "The conflict is expected to grow."

Zyuganov finished second in Russia's presidential elections last year and since, has remained largely sidelined and subdued within the State Duma, the Communistdominated lower house of parliament.

At the latest party congress, he was 're-elected party leader after calling for a constructive opposition and rejecting calls for mass street protests against President Boris Yeltsin's government.

Young Communists and others are unhappy about such a stance. Last week, some young radicals hurled rotten tomatoes at Zyuganov as he placed a wreath at Vladimir Lenin's Mausoleum on the Bolshevik leader's birthday anniversary.

The youths wanted to protest Zyuganov "attaching the name of the great proletarian revolutionary, V.I. Lenin, to his opportunist party", the ITAR-Tass news agency reported Tuesday.

Seven youths, aged from 15 to 22, were detained. Two of them, who are under-age, will not be brought to trial and the rest might face up to five years behind bars, it quoted Interior Ministry officials as saying. "There has been a split within the opposition", said Anatoly Baranov, deputy editor-in-chief of the Communist Pravda-5 newspaper. "The official opposition, represented by Gennady Zyuganov, has lost its spirit and can no longer fulfill its functions."

COMMENT:

Again, we have to state that all these splits and counter-splits have to be looked at from an objective point of view, since the process of crystalization among the Communist parties is taking place, with Soviet people becoming more and more aware of "who is who" and start to compare words with deeds.

At the same time, we must wonder as to who is behind all these splits and new movements appearing and disappearing. That is why the question of UNITY is paramount now!

Newspaper "Workers-Farmers Pravda", organ of the All Union Communist Party of Bolsheviks, is being closed, according to information published in its April 15, 1997 issue.



It is reported that the Attorney General of Ukraine, through his Prosecutor in Mukachevo, where the AUCPB newspaper is published, has singled out this fighting Bolshevik newspaper, because it exposes the nationalistic reactionary policies of the present Kuchma regime of Ukraine. Mr. Kuchma (President) likes to brag and allay the fears of the population, saying that this "independent Ukraine" is "democratic, freedom of speech is guaranteed, pluralism, private enterprise and freedom of conscience, etc., etc.", but in actual fact, the present nationalistic regime is hell-bent on destroying any criticism or any truth about the quasi-fascist powers that control the mass media from reaching the people.

It is (to us here in NSC) very interesting to note that other communist and socialist newspapers are not feeling the same censorship and being banned as is the publication of the AUCPB "Workers-Farmers Pravda" is subjected to!

Interesting question to ask yourself is – "WHY?"

• In Siberia, at the garrison of Northern Fleet, wives of service men picketed the fleet and administrative naval buildings for back wages that their husbands did not receive since February.


• In Kirov, Vladimir and Kursk regions, teachers refused to give exams to the students as a protest until they get paid their back wages.


• In the Buryatia district of Zaigraevskom, 11 teachers went on hunger strike to demand back pay for 6 months.

• According to government statistics, from the beginning of 1997 in the country, there were over 720,000 workers who were on strike. Compared to last year, the figure grew by 5 times.

SOCIAL DEMOCRATS KEEP KLAUS IN POWER

The right wing coalition government of the Czech Republic headed by prime minister Klaus won a vote of confidence in the chamber of deputies by a mere two votes in the 200 member chamber on June 9th. The victory was made possible thanks to the support of Social Democratic MP Josef Wagner and the defection of another Social Democrat earlier this year to Klaus's ODS party, reports Postmark Praha in its June supplement. The paper further makes reference to the fact that the Klaus government will now be able to push ahead with its "stabilization and recovery plan" which will cut \$1.4 billion from public spending; this in order to deal with the state budgetary deficit by year's end. According to polls taken last May, two-thirds of the Czech public have lost confidence in their government and the popularity of the ODS has fallen from a high 30% to a mere 18%.

On May 16th, the government announced an economic package which included wage cuts in the public sector, wage restraint in the private sector and the slashing of public spending by 5%. On May 27th, Klaus announced that the national bank would no longer defend the

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value of the Czech crown having spent \$3 billion of its \$11 billion foreign exchange reserves in this vain attempt. This in fact is a devaluation of the currency which the main trade union centre CMKOS estimates to be 15% ... Figures released May 25 indicate that the foreign trade deficit is running at 8% of GDP while inflation is also running at an annual rate of 8%.

The Central Bank raised interest rates in May and the government introduced various emergency economic measures aimed at slowing the already shrinking economy in order to cut imports and boost exports. The prime minister has warned the Czech people that they would have to further tighten their belts as a result of lower real wages, higher prices and higher unemployment. Prices of consumer goods have increased by 15% to 20% as a result of the currency devaluation announced in May.

Meanwhile, President Vaclav Havel has returned from a visit to Washington and President Clinton who is deeply concerned about developments in the Czech republic lest these affect NATO's enlargement plans. It should be noted that the defence ministry has not been affected by any cuts in expenditures. The leader of the Civic Democratic Alliance (Micheal Zantovski) has also returned from the U.S.A. echoing the call of the IMF and World Bank to increase the pace of privatization and deregulate rents and energy prices.

So far, all these measures have failed to solve the country's economic crises. PP reports that agriculture has ceased to be self-sufficient since 1989 and the country now relies on imported food. Industrial output on a year over year basis is continuing to fall in real terms. The trade gap is widening, the balance of payments deficit continues to grow and living standards continue to fall.

The Communist Party (KSCM) is calling for the resignation of the present government and its replacement by an interim government of experts capable of tackling the country's ever deepening economic crises. It charges that the economic transformation started in 1990 was built on foundations of sand and that a policy that relies on market forces and non-intervention is doomed to failure. On June 9 in the town of Ostrava, 4,000 people stood in pouring rain to hear Communist leaders who were joined by tenants, union and pensioners' leaders denounce rent increases and unemployment. The failure of the official trade union movement meanwhile is coming under increasing pressure for its refusal to join the protests in the interest of stability. The social democrats for their part are refusing to join in a common effort to defeat the government wooing instead the Christian democrats in the hopes of forming the next Czech government in a coalition with them.



Comrade Ken Biggs I met in Prague just a month ago, when I was invited there to speak at a conference on "Security Issues in Central Europe", and the Polish Comrades, whose paper you have an article on, are also good friends of ours. Last year, we had a group of young members from their party at our Summer Camp to study the building up of a youth organization, and Comrade Zbigniew W. has been with us several times. Dear Comrades:

I thank you very much for your latest number of NSC plus other interesting publications, such as International Struggle that you've sent me and I will try to answer some of the questions that you asked me. If I hear correct, that you Michael might be coming here, I certainly will welcome you in our Hero City of Sevastopol.

Regarding your questions:

• I understand the kind of hurt that you comrades feel at the situation in our former Soviet Union and its splintering into pieces, plus splits in the communist movement in Russia (as also Ukraine and others), but for me, as a person professionally dedicated to history of my country and above all in its political complexity, today's situation does not present itself as different from previous situations in our country. The question is this: that similar situations were in evidence and transpired in Russia in the period between the First and Second Russian revolutions (June 1907 - February 1917).

At that time, amongst the Bolsheviks, there were also few fractions amongst whom the big was "Leninists", "Otzovisty", "Mezhdurayontsy". Amongst the Mensheviks till 1914, there existed two groups-fractions: "Mensheviks party members" (Plekhanovtsi) and "Mensheviks - liquidators", and between the period of 1905-1917, there were numerous fractions in the Menshevik ranks. Amongst the Socialist-Revolutionaries (Yeserovtsi) between 1905-1917, there were 10 fractions. Why is it that these were called "fractions" while in reality they all became members of the Communist Party.

In this way, 80-90 years back, the splits in the revolutionary movement in Russia was more numerous than it is at the present time. The name of Lenin in 1916 was known at the most by only about .01% of the population of Russian Empire.

Therefore, it is of no use to search for the reasons for the present Communist splitting into many groups and solely blame opportunism or the influence and provocations of the secret state police of Yeltsin, although it is a factor.

In politics as in nature, there is a place for natural selection, and for the process of natural selection, there is always a need for much material, so that there will be plenty to choose from. If another socialist revolution in Russia is a necessity and imminent historically, then this historical revolution will take place and from amongst the many communist parties, the people will choose the one that will be able to accomplish this historical necessary revolution.

Regarding the revolutionary Albanians and sleepy Russians, here we could explain that Albania from the end of 14th century to 1912 was a colony of Turkish Ottoman Empire - at that time, Albanians were for Turks as Chechens were to Russians. It is natural that these people did not persevere for long. Regarding the Russians, it is good to remember what German Kaiser Bismarck said: "Russians take a long time to harness a horse, but then they fly very fast" or how the people talked when J.V. Stalin was alive "Soviet state perseveres for a long time, but they strike very hard and there is terrible pain". I feel that by the end of 1997, Russians will unfurl and will surprise their friends across the world.

Dear Editor:

Just received my June copy of "Postmark Praha". According to it, there was a recent congress of the CPRF. There was nothing said on its nature or results. So far, I have seen no other mention of it.

Whether or not you see fit to publish my article is not too important, but what I said about a possible split, I still feel, is valid. Whatever the results of the congress, I don't think that possibility is eliminated, unless the Zyuganov leadership is willing to commit itself to a fighting program for a return to socialism. That I don't think they are honestly willing to do. Even if they did, they could not be depended on to consistently carry it out.

I don't think it is logical to see the CPRF membership as one homogeneous mass. Its leadership and part of its membership may be made up of former lower echelon apparatchiks and functionaries, but it would be wrong to think the majority is not made up of dedicated communists and community activists, even though they may not be clearly oriented. We would be kidding ourselves, if we really believed any one group there is. Not to say any of them are all wrong. They all have elements of a practical program back to socialism. But none of them have all the answers. Do we think we have?

Until we have a comprehensive

report on the proceedings and decisions of the congress, it isn't possible to draw any all-round conclusions.

Upon reading about the congress, the thoughts that came to mind were, Zyuganov's and company had to be aware that large sections of the party couldn't help but be, to say the least, unhappy with his performance during and even after the presidential elections, and might demand a change in direction. In particular, specific measures to combat the Yeltsin forces and begin a move back to socialism. In light of that, they also had to be aware some compromises would have to be made to avoid a determined battle over policy, possibly leading to a split. Such a split would torpedo Zyuganov's political ambitions. His political leverage depends on a widely based and strong political structure. Any breakaway would seriously weaken his position.

Whatever the results, for good or bad, even with a division of its forces, the CPRF will remain a major factor in the political life of the country. That, we can only ignore to our detriment.

No doubt you spend a great deal of time poking through the bourgeois media garbage, searching for any truth cast out. Often, the elite bourgeois journals are more truthful than the mass propaganda outlets, where it seems the bourgeois seems to feel that issues are too serious to waste time on the idiotic drivel spooned to the masses. Seeming isn't so, of course, so even it must be read carefully.

A case in point is the enclosed article from the Wall Street Journal on the March 17 demonstrations in Russia. I suspect a certain amount of "whistling by the graveyard" in its account. Not least because of its late date! Nonetheless, I expect there are a few valid points in it. First, the demonstrations themselves failed of their supposed purpose, a mass demo of the labor movement, 18 million strong. This is unpleasant, but facing facts is the Communist way of politics. Second, the CPRF is dismissed as a serious oppositional force. Third, the problem is the leadership which is not truly fighting back against the savage economic class war being fought against the workers. Fourth, the most important enemy of the real Communists is the renegade "labor" bureaucracy. Note especially how the writer dishonestly tries to paint the union leaders as ex-Communists, yet gloats when they go so far as to rough up Communist demonstrators in Tver!

Now, even when a bourgeois journalist is trying to report honestly

in the expectation that it's for his masters instead of hoi polloi, ideological nuttiness creeps in. Who, with any understanding, is really surprised that mass strikes rock the foundations of a worker's state? Political imperfections do not change the fact that the Soviet state rested upon the workers, and when they moved, the Soviet state shook from bottom to top. Mass strike and demonstrations may threaten a bourgeois state, as recently in Italy and France, but those were and are the weapons of the class enemies of the proletariat. They are always against labor.

But to move beyond the ABCs of politics: Naturally, the bourgeois writer does not ask the real questions posed. Was the mass demonstration intended to fail? Or, is it an omen of the final discrediting of the lackeys of democracy? I urge you to dedicate what you can of your scarce resources to examining the labor scene for the answers.

I cannot end without praise for the early interest in the Albanian Revolution. Whether it wins or fails, the Salvation Committees are surely the nomologous forms of Soviets. As such, their emergence is one of the most critical events since the October Massacre which completed the (temporary, I hope!) counter revolution in the Russian Federation proper. There have been fragmentary reports that some demonstrators in Russia have already been influenced by the example. This is possibly of the utmost significance.
